## <u>November – Month of the Holy Souls</u>

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

By tradition, in November we remember and pray for the repose of the souls of our dead. In this month, many people undertake the spiritual exercises to obtain a Plenary Indulgence for the Faithful Departed. The Pope has released some changes to the normal practice. The Decree containing these modifications was signed on 22 October, the liturgical memorial of Pope St John Paul II.

#### Plenary Indulgence during month of November

Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups from forming where prohibited, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1 to 8 November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed.

## Plenary Indulgence for Feast of All Souls' Day

Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to Åll Souls' Day, Monday 2 November, this year it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence. These conditions are Confession and Holy Communion (when these will later be available) and a prayer for the Pope's intentions. You can visit the church by logging on to <u>churchservices.tv/cockhill</u> or imagining yourself there.

#### The homebound

For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including anti-Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence by "uniting themselves spiritually to other members of the faithful". In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain.

The Decree suggests that such prayer take place before an "image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary". Among the various prayers that are recommended are "prayers for the deceased, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, meditating on various Gospel passages proposed for the liturgy of the Dead, or completing a work of mercy by offering to God the suffering and discomforts of one's own life".

## **Invitation to Priests**

As soon as it will be possible, Confessions will be made available again. Holy Communion can still be brought to those who are gravely ill or in danger of death.

## READINGS FOR 33<sup>RD</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**First Reading.** Most of Proverbs originated with Solomon about 1000 BC. 'It is the most representative work of Israelite wisdom literature.' It begins with a father commending wisdom to his child and ends with today's passage. Pearls were prized above all other jewels. The source and sum of all the virtues described in Proverbs is wisdom. Hence 'The woman who is wise is the one to praise.' Into the heart of the home she brings and preserves wisdom, i.e. respect for Yahweh. All activities are to be ordered under that. The same today and forever. (Note this theme in today's psalm.)

 $2^{nd}$  Reading. It does not matter that the Day of the Lord is going to come like a thief in the night. As sons of the light, we belong to the day, and must not, will not, be caught off guard: '....we should not go on sleeping, as everyone else does, but stay wide awake....' Gospel. (Mt 25:14-30). The person gifted with the Faith, 'that pearl of great price', but who allows it to lie dormant, neglecting to bring it to full flower and maturity with imagination and creativity, is here condemned. In fact the Lord is described as shunning and rejecting the indolent Christian, the opposite of 'the woman who is wise' in our first reading, as 'good for nothing.' '.....throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
